





ATTENDANCE IN VCE

LEARNING IS MAXIMISED WHEN STUDENTS ATTEND SCHOOL

THE COLLEGE STRONGLY DISCOURAGES ANY EXTENDED ABSENCES FOR HOLIDAYS/OVERSEAS TRIPS IN VCE

➤ 90% ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT



90% ATTENDANCE

> NO MORE THAN 10% UNAPPROVED ABSENCE

8 LESSONS (4 DOUBLES) UNAPPROVED ABSENCE UNSATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF UNIT

> 15 LESSONS (8 DOUBLES) – APPROVED ABSENCE = AT RISK OF UNSATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF UNIT

STUDENT PUNCTUALITY

LATE = $\frac{1}{2}$ PERIOD UNAPPROVED ABSENCE

16 TIMES LATE = 8 LESSONS - UNAPPROVED
ABSENCE

RESITS — REDEMPTION TASKS

STUDENT ACHIEVES BELOW 40% ON A TASK STUDENTS ALLOWED TO SIT A RESIT IF

- A REASONABLE ATTEMPT AT THE ORIGINAL TASK HAS BEEN MADE
- NOT DONE A RESIT BEFORE IN THAT SUBJECT THAT SEMESTER
- WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

ALTERNATIVE TASKS

STUDENT IS ABSENT FOR AN OUTCOME TASK

STUDENTS **EXPECTED** TO COMPLETE AN ALTERNATIVE TASK ON THE **NEXT** THURSDAY AFTER THE ABSENCE.

A MEDICAL CERTIFICATE MUST BE PROVIDED WITHIN 5 DAYS. FAILURE TO DO THIS WILL RESULT IN AN 'S' ONLY.

ABSENCE ON THE DAY OF A SAC

FROM THE SAC

• IF A STUDENT IS ABSENT FROM SCHOOL AND MISSES A SAC THE STUDENT MUST PRODUCE A VALID MEDICAL CERTIFICATE FROM A DOCTOR OR HAVE A SIGNIFICANT REASON FOR THE ABSENCE.

FROM OTHER CLASSES ON THE DAY

- STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO ATTEND EVERY TIMETABLED LESSON BEFORE A SAC TASK.
- IF CLASSES ARE MISSED ON THE DAY OF A SAC A MEDICAL CERTIFICATE MUST BE PROVIDED.

- MAKE APPOINTMENTS OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS
- CONTACT THE SCHOOL WITH CONCERNS
- ENCOURAGE SPORT/RELAXATION/SENSIBLE SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR
- ENCOURAGE EFFECTIVE TIME MANAGEMENT
- ENSURE DAILY ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL
- ATTEND PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES TERMS 1 & 3

- TO CHECK THAT YOU HAVE THE CORRECT PREREQUISITES FOR UNIVERSITY COURSES
- YOUR TIME AT SCHOOL IS NOT GOING AS PLANNED AND YOU NEED
 TO LOOK INTO OTHER OPPORTUNITIES THAT MAY BE AVAILABLE
- COURSE RESEARCH AND ADVICE RE FUTURE COURSES AND PATHWAYS
- HELP CREATING A RESUME, ORGANISING WORK EXPERIENCE OR PLACEMENTS
- SUBJECT CHANGE ADVICE



- IF FOR WHATEVER REASON YOUR CHILD IS CONSIDERING AN ALTERNATE SCHOOL OR WORK OPTIONS.
- THIS MIGHT BE BECAUSE YOUR CHILD IS NOT HAVING A POSITIVE START TO THE YEAR OR GETTING BELOW EXPECTED RESULTS THEN IT IS VERY IMPORTANT TO COME AND SEE US EARLY RATHER THAN LATER TO SEE WHAT WE CAN HELP THEM WITH.
- IT ENABLES US TO PRESENT OTHER OPTIONS TO YOUR CHILD WHICH MAY BE MORE SUITABLE OR HELP TO GIVE NEW GOALS TO INCREASE THEIR MOTIVATION TO LEARN.
